The 20th-century political philosopher Isaiah Berlin (1909-97) thought that the answer to both these questions was 'Yes', and in his essay 'Two Concepts of Liberty' (1958) he distinguished two kinds of freedom (or liberty; Berlin used the words interchangeably), which he called negative freedom and positive freedom.

In "Two Concepts of Liberty", Isaiah Berlin examines two different conceptions of freedom: positive and negative liberty. He begins by discussing negative freedom, which he defines as "the area within which the subject ... is or should be left to do or be what he is able to do or be, without interference by other persons" (169).

In 1957, a year after he had married Aline Halban (née de Gunzbourg), Berlin was elected Chichele Professor of Social and Political Theory at Oxford (his inaugural lecture, delivered in 1958, was Two Concepts of Liberty ). Later in 1957 he was knighted.
